

Durham’s performance this season has been amongst the best for all players at his position, not only in the Southeastern Conference (SEC), but also in the NCAA. According to <http://espn.go.com/mens-college-basketball>, as of February 17, 2016, Bro. Durham:

- Is second in the SEC and Ranks #14 in the country with 6.4 assists per game;
- Had 5-plus assists in 19 straight games this year, the longest streak by a Razorback since joining the SEC;
- Is the ONLY player in the country to record two games of 10-

plus points and assists and five-plus steals;

- One seven players in the country with five double-digit assist performances this year;
- Has five of the fifteen double-digit assist games in the SEC this year;
- Is one of ten players in the country with four games of five-plus steals this year;

In addition to Brother Durham’s statistical leadership on the basketball court, he has also excelled off the court as a Public Health major at the University of Arkansas. Brother Durham also serves as Basileus of the Gamma Eta Chapter at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. Upon graduation, Brother Durham seeks to pursue his dream of becoming a professional basketball player, whether in the NBA, via the D-League as a training ground for developing players, or overseas... either of which will serve as a subsequent testament to his “Perseverance”, no matter the outcome of this career path trajectory. This award was established by the AFLV Conference to recognize an outstanding fraternity or sorority alumnus/a volunteer and/or an indi-

vidual who supports the fraternal movement but is not a professional campus fraternity/sorority advisor. The recipient of this award exemplifies the fraternal values established by the AFLV founders through exceptional ethical leadership that reaches beyond the traditional models. He/she has:

- Provided sustained service beyond his/her own organization;
- Demonstrated belief and commitment to the true interfraternal philosophy in their actions, and;
- Fostered positive change to advance the fraternal movement;
- In addition, a qualified nominee for this award:
- Exhibits exceptional ethical leadership in daily activities;
- Consistently and routinely exemplifies the fraternal values established by the AFLV founders;
- Has the courage to reach beyond the traditional models and procedures to accomplish goals;
- Exhibits a strong belief and commitment in philosophy and action to interfraternalism;
- Fosters positive change that advances the fraternal movement;
- The winner of this award has given exceptional and sustained service to his/her own fraternity/sorority and/or campus community and/or the extended Interfraternal world;



Brother Adams, who is an associate professor of chemistry and biochemistry, as well as cellular and molecular biology at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, currently serves as chapter advisor to the Gamma Eta Chapter of Omega at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. He also serves as the 9th District Advisor for the state of Arkansas. Internationally, Brother Adams serves Omega as the Co-Chairman of the International UG Chapter Advisors’ Committee, and as Chairman of the International Advanced Degree Committee. He is a member of Upsilon Chi graduate chapter of Northwest Arkansas.

Brother Adams was nominated for this honor by the Office of Greek Life, as well as, members of the Interfraternity Council (IFC), and National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. “Not only does Dr. Adams advise our Omega Psi Phi chapter, but he also mentors many other Greeks within our community which makes him a shining example of what inter-fraternalism is all about!” said Mrs. Parice Bowser, director of Greek Life at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. France and the Founding of New Orleans – The first known residents of the New Orleans area were the Native Americans of the Woodland and Mississippian cultures. The expeditions of De Soto (1542) and La Salle (1682) passed through the area, but there were few permanent white settlers before 1718, when the governor of French Louisiana, Jean-Baptiste Le Moyne, Sieur de Bienville, founded the city of Nouvelle-Orléans on the first crescent of high ground above the Mississippi's mouth. In 1722 he transferred Louisiana's capital from Biloxi. The same year a hurricane destroyed most of the new city, which was rebuilt in the grid pattern of today's French Quarter.


