Theta Alpha Almost Triples ADA Goal



Dallas, TX. Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. has committed to raise \$50,000 on behalf of the American Diabetes Association. Theta Alpha Chapter went above and beyond almost tripling its goal of \$500 with over \$1400 raised.

Saturday November 5, 2005, Theta Alpha Chapter of Omega Psi Phi took part in the 2005 America's Walk for Diabetes in Dallas Texas. This is the major fundraising effort for the American Diabetes Association and it's chief means of raising awareness about Type 1 and Type 2 Diabetes.

Fifteen brothers along with Quettes walked in the 5 Kilometer Walk/Trot/Run. Omega Psi Phi was "True to Form" being the only Fraternity represented at the walk. Many persons were taking part in this effort because either they or someone dear to them suffers from Diabetes. " Bro. Terry Forest shared, "It is my honor and duty to serve and support the chapter's initiative and programs."

Currently 3 million African American have diabetes. African American's are also twice as likely to have Diabetes as Non-Hispanic Whites. Researchers trace much of this trend to Unhealthy lifestyle choices that prevail in the African American Community. It is a cardinal principle of Omega Psi Phi to provide Uplift and this is a superb opportunity to Uplift the Black community.

Spring Membership Selection Process (MSP)

The proposed window for the Spring 2006 Membership Selection Process is February 05, 2006 through March 26, 2006. All MSP Programs must be completed by midnight of March 26, 2006. All packets must be completed and mailed within seven (7) days of completed initiation. There will be no exceptions to this requirement. The seven-week window allows sufficient flexibility for both graduate and undergraduate chapters to participate in the process. No processes will be authorized to begin prior to the Winter Council Meeting.

We are reviewing several MSP Programs for the fall 05 window; as well as, packets from previous windows. We anticipate all MSP Processes will be completed by the end of December 2005. For all spring 2006 Membership selection Processes the following information must be provided in a timely manner:

- Submit a completed Form One.
- Provide proof of payment of chapter insurance for fiscal years 2004-2005 and 2005-2006.
- Provide proof of payment of College Endowment Fund for fiscal years 2004-2005 and 2005-2006.

Note that no chapter's process will be approved without the above items.

This is a scholarship in the amount of one thousand dollars. Lloyd will attend Tuskegee University to study engineering. Ironically, he was presented his award by the Ninth District Keeper of Finance Brother Shawn Brewer, who was initiated at and graduated from Tuskegee University. OGG has and will maintain its commitment to the youth by investing in their future today, securing a brighter tomorrow for the community.

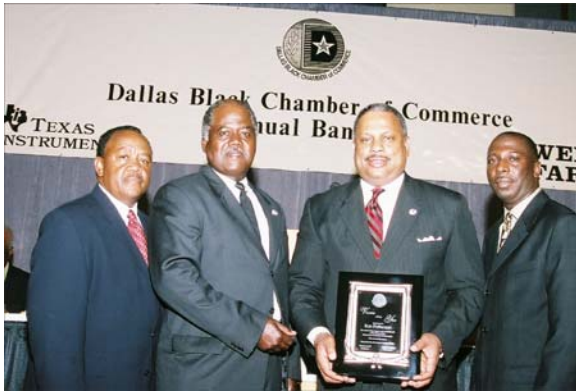

For the past couple of years, the chapter has hosted, in conjunction with a private clinic in Norman, Oklahoma, HIV screening for students and faculty at the university. Pi Delta also hosted our 15th annual Que-bowl, a bowling tournament amongst Greek organizations, faculties and other students. This event is a fundraiser raising money to benefit the Muscular Dystrophy Association and the United Negro College Fund. Other events included during this week were the Charles R. Drew Blood Drive (total of 21 people donated blood), and movie night with the “bruhs”. We also attended three different inner-city high schools during this week where we offered our chapter’s scholarship opportunity and principals were enthusiastic in wanting us to put on a small show so the Pi Delta brothers were also “owt” while we uplifted. Lastly, we hosted a panel in conjunction with Student African American Brotherhood discussing the issue of unprotected sex and its consequences.

Lewis Selected as Omega Man of the Year



Fraternity Brother Doctor Derek Lewis won the Pi Omicron Chapter, Omega Man of The Year Award for the second straight year. After the tragic death of Brother Jimmy Morris in December 2004, Doctor Lewis became

Basileus of Pi Omicron. He was elected to serve a full term as Basileus in November 2005. Brother Lewis became a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Beta Delta Chapter, in the spring of 1976.

Derek Lewis was one of ten children born in Hughes, a small town in Eastern Arkansas. He takes pride in growing up in this rural community. Derek was a member of the Student Council, band and track team at Hughes High School. He attended The University of Central Arkansas in Conway, where he received a Bachelor of Science Degree in biology and a Master of Science Degree in microbiology. In 1984, he received his Doctor of Medicine from the University of Arkansas Medical School. Doctor Lewis owns and operates two medical clinics in the Greater Little Rock Metropolitan area. He served as Chief of Family Practice as well as Family Practice Controls Committee member for area hospitals. He has conducted several clinical trials with pharmaceutical companies such as Pfizer, Norvartis, Astrazeneca, Glaxo Smith Kline, Tap, Bristol Myers Squibb, Eli Lilly and Sankyo-Pharma.

He founded The Derek Lewis Foundation in 1988. Annually, this foundation financially supports summer programs for youth between the ages of 13 and 16 by teaching them job interviewing skills, financial management skills, time management and business ethics as it pertains to proper dress, job responsibility and accountability. Additionally, The Derek Lewis Foundation assists intercity sports programs, Little Rock Boys and Girls Clubs and the University of Central Arkansas African Alumni Association Scholarship Fund, special projects for Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Pi Omicron Chapter of Little Rock, and various charities.

He is a member Little Rock Chamber of Commerce, American Academy of Family Physicians, Arkansas Medical, Dental and Pharmaceutical Association and Arkansas Medical Society. Also, he is a board member of the Little Rock Chapter of Boys and Girls Club, and past President of the University of Central Arkansas Alumni Association.

Chapters Join Together in Mentoring Program

The brothers of Mu Beta (University of Texas at Arlington) and Omicron Gamma Gamma (Arlington, Texas) have established a Mentoring Program with the Boys and Girls Club of Arlington, Texas. The age range of the young boys is from eight to fourteen years old. The program's mission is to reach back into the minority community and lift as we climb. The program was initially conceived with the purpose of mentoring minority boys local to the Arlington area. However, all races are encouraged to participate as the brothers' positive influence can impact the life of any young male in today's society.



The program is held on a recurring basis throughout the year. As a part of the program, the chapters also conduct special programs during the week to reinforce the bonds made during the weekend sessions. The program focuses on a number of developmental areas including academic tutoring, building relationships with parents, and other critical areas. These sessions allow brothers to go beyond the traditional mentor role and become more involved role models. Bianca Wilson, liaison for the Boys and Girl Club, stated "she had been waiting for the Omegas to start a mentoring program because she could always remember an Omega presence in the community when she was growing up."

Operation Smoke Alarm

On March 19th 2005, the Brothers of Omicron Gamma Gamma participated in the annual "Operation Smoke Alarm" project in Fort Worth, Texas. Since project inception, there has been strong participation at this life saving event which is covered and televised by several local news stations. This was the fourth straight year that the brothers participated in the project. The project was developed to proactively combat the rising death tolls associated with preventable fires. With Omicron Gamma Gamma's help, approximately 479 smoke alarms and 396 batteries were installed in the South East side of Fort Worth. The Fort Worth Fire Department commended the Brothers of OGG for once again rising to the occasion and battling social problems that plague the Mid-Cities area.

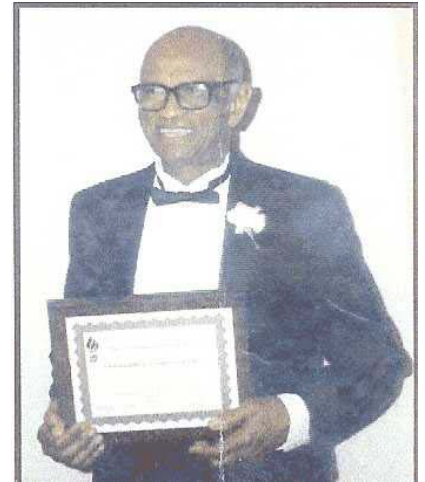

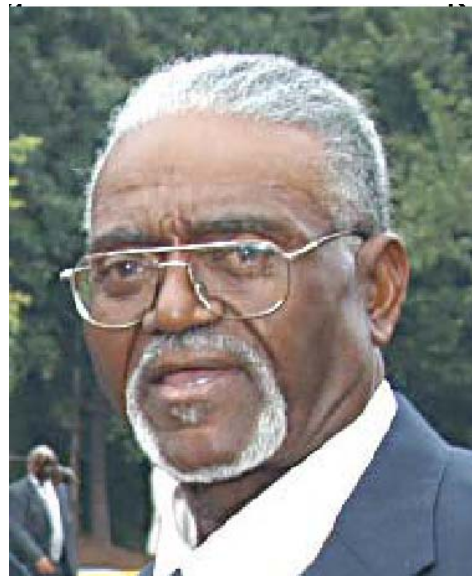

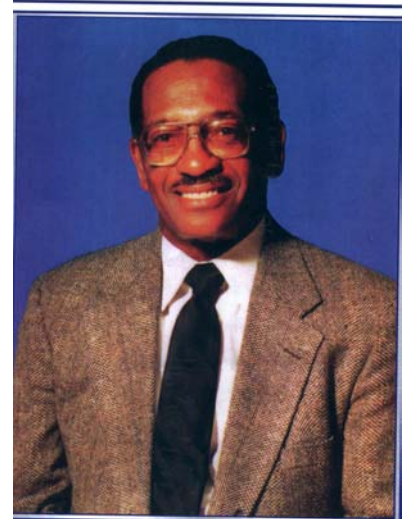

The Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and the Ninth District suffered a terrible loss with the passing of Brother Walter L. Littlejohn. Brother Littlejohn entered Omega Chapter on August 26, 2005. Brother Littlejohn's service to our great Fraternity began on January 15, 1952 through the Tau Sigma Chapter. He served in a number of positions, culminating with serving as the District Representative for the Ninth District from 1978 to 1981. He was the 9th Brother to serve in this capacity.

Brother Littlejohn's journey to service began in Pine Bluff, Arkansas on March 5, 1932, the son of the late Ed and Beatrice Littlejohn. He accepted Christ at an early age, served faithfully as a trustee at the Saint Paul Baptist Church until his health declined. He continued to attend Sunday School and worship services regularly until days recent to his passing.



After graduating from Coleman High School, Brother Littlejohn attended the Agricultural, Mechanical, and Normal College, graduating with a Bachelor of Science Degree in mathematics. Continuing on with his scholarship, he earned the Master of Education degree in 1957 and the Doctor of Education degree in secondary education in 1966 from the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville.

Brother Littlejohn served in a number of capacities in the Walker School District in Magnolia, Arkansas, culminating with serving as superintendent of schools. From there he moved to Texas Southern University and served as an assistant professor of education administration. He traveled back to his Alma Mata, AM&N/UAPB and served in a number of positions, including Chair, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education; Dean, Division of Teacher Education; Dean, School of Education, and Coordinator of Graduate Programs. Brother Littlejohn is well published and made many presentations, including a presentation in Mexico on "The Preparation of Teachers." He was a life member of the National Education Association, and served on a number of committees including the Governor's Advisory Committee on Teacher Licensure. He served as president and CEO of the AM&N/UAPB Credit Union for over 20 years.

Brother Littlejohn was a life member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. His contributions to the fraternity are numerous, including serving as Basileus of the Tau Phi Chapter. He was selected as the Omega Man of the Year for the Pi Omicron Chapter. He is a charter member of the Kappa Chi Chapter. He also served on the Supreme Council. Throughout his fraternal life, he attended numerous conclaves across the United States and more than 40 Ninth District Meetings.

He was also a member of the Pi Boule' Fraternity and the Twentieth Century Club. He was al loyal fan and supporter of the UAPB Golden Lions and a friend of the Arkansas Razorbacks.

He is survived by his loving and devoted wife of 50 years, the former Virginia Lowery; a brother, Arthur Littlejohn; two sisters, Ruth Kyser and Sammie Littlejohn; a loving, caring nephew, fraternity brother, and friend, Albert Lowery, Jr; a devoted cousin and friend, William Clark; and a host of nieces, nephews, and other relatives and friends.
